National Labor Relations Board Postpones Effective Date of Employee Rights Posting Rule

Today, the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) announced that it would again postpone the effective date of its new rule which would require all private sector employers covered by the National Labor Relations Act (NLRA) to post an 11-by-17 inch poster advising employees of their right to organize a union and other rights under the NLRA. The postponement was made at the request of the federal court in Washington, D.C., which is the forum for lawsuits filed by business groups challenging the legality of the posting requirement.
