### **LAWYER SPOTLIGHT**

Greg Moroux was born in El Camp, Texas. He was raised in Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Germany and Louisiana. His father was a career military soldier, originally from Louisiana.

Greg graduated from Notre Dame High School in Crowley, Louisiana. He then attended University of Southwestern Louisiana and graduated in 1973 with a degree in Geography and Urban Studies. Greg worked his way through USL as a radio announcer. He graduated from Louisiana State University's law school in 1979.

Greg began his legal career in Baton Rouge in mortgages, collections, and Regulation Z cases. He was appointed an Assistant U.S. Attorney (Criminal Division) of the Western District of Louisiana where he prosecuted federal crimes exclusively in the federal courts. While an Assistant U.S. Attorney, his focus was narcotics prosecutions, and he handled criminal cases that included: civil rights, bank fraud, mail fraud, weapons and explosives violations, narcotics, federal intimidation, extortion, counterfeit, bank robbery, import/export violations, Medicare fraud, and others.

Greg left the U.S Attorney's Office to focus on an insurance defense practice, including premises liability, automobiles, insurance issues, and commercial liability. He also represented governmental entities in Civil Service matters, Fire and Police Civil Service, Police Misconduct, Civil Rights, Expropriation and Imminent Domain, Land Use, and Insurance issues in public liability. Greg also was panel counsel for the State of Louisiana in its DOTD cases. He defended some high profile celebrity cases. His practice now focuses on employment and health care law.

Greg's biggest legal victory was winning a toxic tort case involving fumes from glue, which was the longest trial of his career. His hobbies include woodworking, reading, bicycling, computers, travel and rowing.
